

# Follow your child's lead

Watch what interests them. Join in play without directing.

# Simplify & Repeat Language

Use short phrases. Repeat important words: "More Juice"

# **Use Gestures & Visuals**

Point, wave, and nod. Use pictures if helpful.

# Face-to-face Interaction

Get on their level. Use animated expressions

# Model, Don't Pressure

Show how to communicate.

Don't force talking

# **Expand & Recast**

Child: "Ball!"

You: "Yes, a big ball!"

### Pause & Wait

Give your child time to respond. Count to 5 silently.

Cause & Effect toys: Use words like "go", "pop"

Pretend Play: Talk about actions: "Wash doll", "Drive car"





#### **SONGS & RHYMES**

USE GESTURES: ITSY, BITSY SPIDER, WHEELS ON THE BUS

PAUSE BEFORE KEY WORDS:
"TWINKLE TWINKLE LITTLE...[WAIT]
STAR"
